 April 25, 2023

The City of Pierre Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session on April 25, 2023 with Commissioners Barringer, Huizenga, Todd Johnson, Vona Johnson and Mayor Harding present for roll call. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited followed by an invocation. The agenda was approved as posted. No one was present for public comment.

Mayor Harding issued a Proclamation for National Library Week and Arbor Day.

Commissioner Barringer moved and Commissioner Todd Johnson seconded to approve the consent calendar to include the Minutes from the Regular Meeting on April 18, 2023; Set May 2, 2023 5:45pm Public Hearing – Airport Lease Kroeplin Air; Set May 2, 2023 5:45pm Public Hearing – Malt Beverage License for Zap Baseball at Hyde Stadium; Raffle Request – PAWS Animal Rescue; New Hire Golf Department – Nick Bothun \$17; New Hire Park Department Seasonal – Brady Getz \$17; New Hire Water Department Seasonal CDL – Charles Fergen \$27; Joint Plat of Lot 1R, Block 2, Farm Island View Estates, Kyle & Jori Glodt; Claims. This being the time and place to consider the Dakotamart Package Off-Sale Liquor and Retail On/Off Sale Malt Beverage License Transfer, Mayor Harding opened the hearing. Tim Murphy, Dakotamart Manager, explained that the business was previously owned by James and Donald Feist and now is only owned by James Feist. No one was present to comment. Commissioner Huizenga moved and Commissioner Vona Johnson seconded to approve the Package Off-Sale Liquor License Transfer from Dakotamart Inc to Dakotamart. Unanimous approval. Commissioner Huizenga moved and Commissioner Todd Johnson seconded to approve the Retail On/Off Sale Malt Beverage License Transfer from Dakotamart Inc to Dakotamart. Unanimous approval.

This being the time and place to consider the temporary Malt Beverage License for the Pierre Area Chamber of Commerce for the Lake Sharpe Showdown Fishing tournament at River Cities Public Transit on April 28th and Steamboat Park on April 29-30th, Mayor Harding opened the hearing. Tia Kafka explained that they will be hosting the rules meeting and dinner at the Transit building Friday night and have obtained permission to have and sell beer during the event from Transit. They will also have a beer tent during the weigh-ins in Steamboat Park on Saturday and Sunday. Police Chief Jason Jones commented that he has reviewed their plans, which are similar to Oahe Days structure and he has no issues. No one else was present to comment. Commissioner Todd Johnson moved and Commissioner Barringer seconded to approve the temporary Malt Beverage License for the Chamber at River Cities Public Transit on April 28th and Steamboat Park on April 29-30th. Unanimous approval.

Bryan Tipton, Park & Recreation Director, explained the list of request items for the Lake Sharpe Showdown in Steamboat Park. They would like to use the Amphitheatre, close the parking lot near the Amphitheatre Saturday and Sunday April 29-30, have the Street Department place barricades for the parking closure, and use tables and garbage containers for the event. Commissioner Vona Johnson moved and Commissioner Huizenga seconded to approve the request list as presented for the Lake Sharpe Showdown Fishing Tournament. Unanimous approval.

Brian Cowles, Airport Manager, presented the short term lease with Dakota Pro Air for 50x60 space referred to as lot #41. The lease will run 5/15 thru 8/31 for \$514.64. Commissioner Huizenga moved and Commissioner Vona Johnson seconded to approve the short term Airport lease with Dakota Pro Air as presented. Unanimous approval.

Jeff Runyan, Construction & Operations Manager, explained that the Water Department will be utilizing a new process for providing water during water main replacement projects. Previously water was shut off every morning and reconnected every evening with a boil order. This year they will provide temporary water to all services affected by the construction. Water will be tested and then turned on to provide service during the duration of the project. This will avoid loss of service during the day and the hassle of boil orders every evening. The process will be much more efficient for water crews.

Twila Hoffrogge, Finance Officer, presented Ordinance 1853 to supplement the 2023 Budget in the Library Department for \$2,175 for donations received. Commissioner Vona Johnson gave first reading to Ordinance 1853 AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED AN APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE SUPPLEMENTAL TO ORDINANCE NO. 1845, THE 2023 ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR NECESSARY FUNCTIONS OF GOVERNMENT FOR WHICH NO APPROPRIATIONS OR INSUFFICIENT APPROPRIATIONS WERE PROVIDED.

Twila Hoffrogge, Finance Officer, presented Ordinance 1852 for \$100,000 to purchase 2 police vehicles. Commissioner Vona Johnson moved and Commissioner Huizenga seconded to approve Ordinance 1852 AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED AN APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE SUPPLEMENTAL TO ORDINANCE NO. 1845, THE 2023 ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR NECESSARY FUNCTIONS OF GOVERNMENT FOR WHICH NO APPROPRIATIONS OR INSUFFICIENT APPROPRIATIONS WERE PROVIDED. Unanimous approval.

Commissioner Huizenga moved and Commissioner Vona Johnson seconded to adjourn. 6:18 pm. Unanimous approval.
